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# SYNOPSIS



Zeventienjarige Shell leeft temidden van de Schotse Hooglanden. Hier, geïsoleerd van de rest van de wereld, woont en werkt ze in het pompstation van haar vader. Nu Shell bijna volwassen is, krijgt ze aandacht van twee mannen: leeftijdgenoot Adam en de gescheiden vader Hugh. Maar Shell kan pas echt op eigen benen staan als ze loskomt uit de relatie met haar vader, die steeds meer begint te lijken op een verhouding tussen geliefden.

Shell is het trefzekere speelfilmdebuut van de veelbelovende regisseur en scenarioschrijver Scott Graham. De film onderscheidt zich door een verbluffend mooie fotografie, waarin het Schotse landschap een glansrol speelt, indrukwekkende acteerprestaties en een fijngevoelige psychologie. Actrice Chloe Pirrie, die recent de British Independent Film Award voor beste nieuwkomer won, is onvergetelijk in de rol van Shell. Op het Brussels Film Festival won Shell afgelopen jaar de White Iris Award voor beste debuut.

# DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT



I had the idea for 'Shell' when I was driving between Glasgow and the north of Scotland. I was passing run down garages and roadside diners and I thought about a character emotionally and physically tied to such an isolated place. There's an emptiness to Shell's life at the petrol station that goes beyond the roadside. It permeates the walls of the house she shares with her broken-hearted father who is both comforted by Shell and haunted by how much she reminds him of her mother, the woman who left him. He has come to depend on her love, her light, her warmth and it's hard for him to let her go though that is what he should do.

Shell is as lonely as we imagine her mother to have been living and working in that isolated place and yet she is willing to stay if her father will love her. She tells a passer-by she doesn't


mind not seeing a car for a week. She seems to think she can survive on love though she never receives any from anyone. She tries to comfort the loneliness she sees in others while never addressing her own. Though her future is uncertain at the end of the film I hope her release feels as uplifting for the audience as it does to her.

# OVER DE REGISSEUR



Scott grew up outside Fraserburgh in the North East of Scotland. He made his first short film, *Born To Run*, set in a fishing port in the North East, during the winter of 2005. His second short, *Shell*, won the UK Film Council Award for Best Film at the London Short Film Festival in 2008. His third short, *Native Son*, was produced by Film Four under their Cinema Extreme banner and premiered in Semaine de la Critique at Cannes 2010. The film stars Sean Harris as a lonely farm labourer at odds with his local community. Scott's first feature, *Shell*, is based on his 2008 short about a teenage girl's life with her father in a remote highland petrol station. Scott was chosen as one of Screen International's UK Stars of Tomorrow in 2011.

# « THE HEART IS A LONELY HUNTER »



In *Shell* is een sleutelrol weggelegd voor *The Heart is a Lonely Hunter*, de debuutroman van de Amerikaanse schrijfster Carson McCullers uit 1940. Filmblog CineVue schrijft over het verband tussen film en boek:

'One of the few passing customers who enters Shell's life gives her a book to keep - *The Heart Is a Lonely Hunter* by Carson McCullers - a novel famous for giving a voice to the rejected, forgotten, mistreated and oppressed, and a fitting metaphor for our heroine's lot.'

*The Heart Is a Lonely Hunter* verhaalt van de dove John Singer en de mensen die hij ontmoet in een klein dorp in Georgia, in de jaren 30. Destijds was de roman, van de toen pas 23 jaar oude McCullers, een literaire sensatie en vandaag de dag geldt het boek als een klassieker.

In 2004 werd *The Heart Is a Lonely Hunter* geselecteerd voor Oprah's Book Club. In 1998 belandde de roman op #17 van de Top 100 beste Engelstalige romans, samengesteld door de Modern Library. Ook op de TIME 100 van beste Engelstalige romans uitgegeven tussen 1923 en 2005 bemachtigde de roman een plaats.
